Virtual and In-Person Public Forums Set Regarding Billing Errors

ALBANY — The New York State Department of Public Service (DPS) and the DPS Consumer Advocate, will hold a **virtual** public forum on **Tuesday, January 31**, and **in-person** public forums on **Wednesday, February 1, Tuesday, February 7, and Wednesday, February 8, 2023**, to receive public comments regarding alleged delayed or erroneous billing, delayed or inaccurate meter reading, and customer service problems affecting customers of New York State Electric & Gas Corporation (NYSEG) and/or Rochester Gas & Electric Corporation (RG&E) (the companies). Comments submitted will become part of the official record for this matter.

To monitor utility performance, DPS staff tracks utility customer service metrics and compiles monthly complaint statistics. DPS staff has observed a significant increase in complaints against the companies and a deterioration in the companies' customer service performance metrics in 2022 and especially since August 2022. Among other issues, customers have reported high, inaccurate, or delayed bills, which they assert are inordinately based on estimated meter readings. These problems have been compounded by the inability of customers to reach the companies' customer service representatives by telephone without substantial delay. As a result of the clear indications of unusual amounts of complaint activity and delayed responses to customers and consumer complaints, DPS staff and the DPS Consumer Advocate will hold in-person and virtual forums in multiple locations in the companies' service territories to gather information about these issues directly from customers.

In addition to these forums, DPS staff and the DPS Consumer Advocate are soliciting public comments via DPS' toll-free opinion line at 1-800-335-2120, or by U.S. mail and through other channels. The purpose of the public forums is for NYSEG and RG&E customers to provide comments on billing, customer service, meter reading, and other service quality issues they have experienced, and to add to the record DPS is compiling regarding these issues.

DPS staff and the DPS Consumer Advocate seek public comments responsive to the following questions:

- Have you received delayed bills or no bills for extended periods of time (e.g., more than one month)?
- If you did not receive a bill for one month or more, how long did it take to receive a bill, and did you possibly receive more than one bill as a "catch-up"?

- If you called your utility to inquire why you did not receive a bill, did you receive timely, accurate and adequate information from your utility about why you were not receiving your bill(s) and when normal billing would resume?
- If you are a customer receiving renewable energy services from a community distributed generation (CDG), have you had any issues with receiving bills, credits, or with inaccurate, delayed, or non-existent credits and billing reconciliations?
- If you are a customer with solar panels or another form of renewable energy, have you had any issues with receiving bills, credits, or with inaccurate, delayed, or nonexistent credits and billing reconciliations? Or have you had troubles with demand metering?
- If you receive supply service through an Energy Service Company (ESCO), have you had any issues with receiving bills, credits, or with inaccurate, delayed, or nonexistent credits and billing reconciliations?

This list is not exhaustive, and comments may be made on other issues related to the companies' performance. Please do not make personalized complaints publicly at a public forum so that you do not inadvertently reveal confidential personal information. Instead, make any and all complaints in the manner(s) set forth below.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that public forums before DPS staff will be held to receive comments regarding billing, meter reading, and customer service problems that have affected customers of the companies since 2022, as follows:

Commenters may be asked follow-up or clarifying questions by DPS staff. Members of the public may attend whichever forum is convenient and attendance is not limited to customers of the utilities.

Any person wishing to provide a public comment on the record at the virtual forums must pre-register by 12:00 p.m. on January 30, 2023.

MONROE COUNTY EXECUTIVE ADAM BELLO ANNOUNCES COMPLETION OF “COMMUNITY ACCESS PLAN AND FUNDING STRATEGY FOR BROADBAND” REPORT

The report, compiled by Magellan Advisors, will serve as a blueprint for the County as it determines how to leverage \$20 million in American Rescue Plan Act funding to improve internet access throughout our community.

ROCHESTER, NY — Monroe County Executive Adam Bello today released the “Community Access Plan and Strategy for Broadband” report that will serve as a blueprint for determining how to best leverage \$20 million in American Rescue Plan Act funding to improve internet access in underserved and unconnected areas of the county.

*“Our digital divide isn’t a new or unique issue, but it is one that holds too many of our residents back from fully participating in economic, educational and civic opportunities,” **said County Executive Bello.** “To truly Bring Monroe Back and reflect Monroe County’s legacy and future as an innovation hub, a great place to raise a family and a place where opportunity abounds for residents and businesses alike, we must find concrete solutions to closing service gaps and eliminating barriers to broadband access. High-speed internet is essential infrastructure — not a luxury — and is as critical to the future of our community’s growth as indoor plumbing, electricity and paved roads.”*

County Executive Bello convened government, civic and nonprofit leaders as the Monroe County Advisory Task Force on Broadband in March 2021 to assess internet services in low income and rural areas of Monroe County, with a goal of finding concrete solutions that will close service gaps and eliminate barriers to access. The county and task force partnered with Magellan Advisors to undertake a robust study of internet services county-wide and make recommendations to guide any future infrastructure or program investments.

*“Access to reliable high speed broadband internet is a critical tool to unlock economic growth and overcome racial and economic disparities across our region. We are proud to partner with County Executive Bello and colleagues on the Broadband Task Force to advance this critical project,” **said Simeon Banister, President and CEO of Rochester Area Community Foundation.** “By investing \$20 million for this essential utility, Monroe County is taking a step in the right direction to improve access to underserved disadvantaged and rural communities.”*

*“As a lifetime resident of Riga and County Legislator representing our rural communities, I know first-hand the need for expansion of high-speed broadband internet into our neighborhoods and farmlands that currently lack this basic necessity,” said **Legislature Majority Leader Steve Brew**. “Delivering high-speed broadband to these areas has been a priority of mine, and I am proud to have served on the Broadband Task Force to do just that. Today’s announcement lays the groundwork for delivering on this promise, and I will continue to work tirelessly until it is finished to the satisfaction of all our neighbors. Thank you to all the members of the Broadband Task Force and my partners in village, town, and county government who have shared in this mission that will soon be a reality.”*

*“High-speed broadband access is no longer a luxury, it’s a necessity,” said **County Legislator Howard Maffucci** (LD 10), a member of the task force. “Everyone, no matter where they live, should have access to fast, reliable, and affordable high-speed internet, and I’m proud to be working with County Executive Bello and the Broadband Task Force to ensure we can achieve that in Monroe County.”*

*“The digital divide across Monroe County became increasingly apparent and troublesome during the COVID pandemic as residents of our communities struggled with remote learning and working from home,” said **Town of Wheatland Supervisor Linda Dobson**. “It soon became clear that a large portion of Wheatland was not adequately served — our scenic, open spaces created long distances for infrastructure installation making digital access or upgrades cost prohibitive for residents. Working with Monroe County Administration and the Broadband Taskforce to clearly identify those rural areas in need and develop a response to close this connectivity gap has been a positive experience. I thank the residents who brought their needs forward, the Task Force for hours spent on this issue, Legislator Brew for his support, and for County Executive Bello and his team for their positive response to address the needs of our corner of Monroe County.”*

The County Executive set aside \$20 million of the county’s \$144 million in federal American Rescue Plan Act funds specifically to address expanding broadband access in underserved areas.

In coming weeks, the Bello administration will review the Magellan report to determine the best path forward, making certain any county plans to expand access align with New York State and nonprofit community broadband goals.

Potential investments include: partnering with private internet service providers to facilitate build-out of broadband infrastructure in rural communities; providing grants, training or one-on-one assistance to encourage more people to take advantage of the federal Affordable Connectivity Program; offering discounts on internet-capable devices to individuals who successfully complete training or education programs; or making free community WiFi hotspots available in publically-accessible areas.

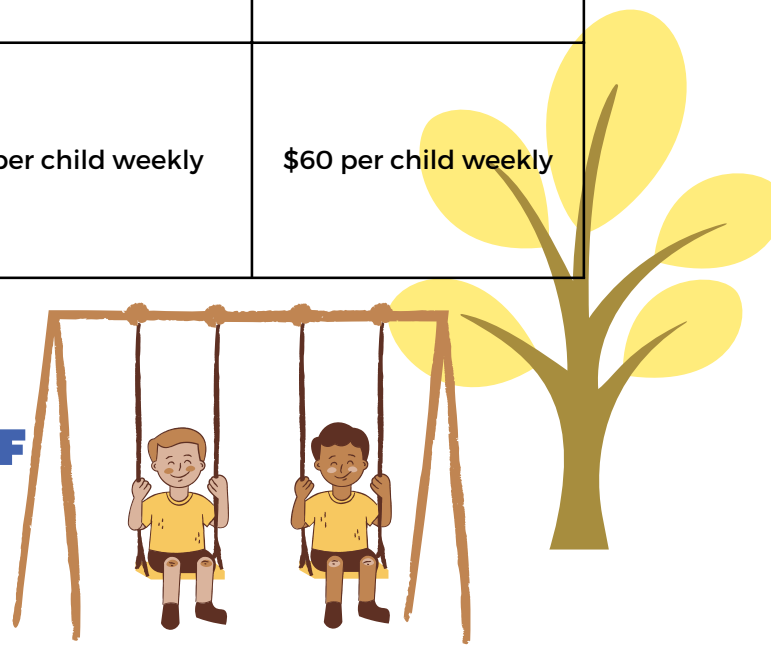

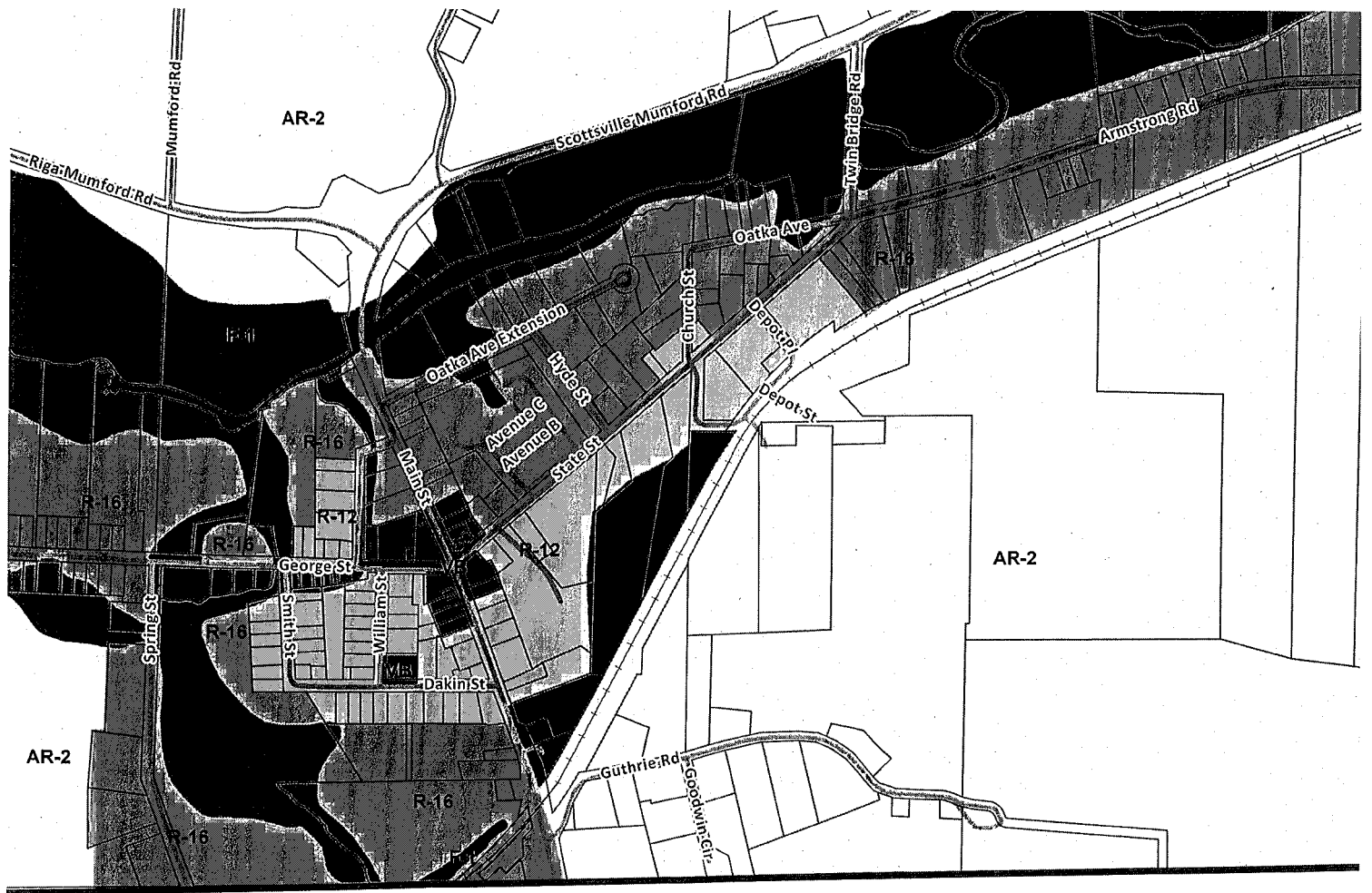

MONROE COUNTY, CHILI, GATES, RIGA, WHEATLAND, CHURCHVILLE AND SCOTTSVILLE TO HOST HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION

The Monroe County Department of Environmental Services, the Towns of Chili, Gates, Riga and Wheatland and the Villages of Churchville and Scottsville will hold an **appointment-only** Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) collection at the Town of Gates Highway Department located at 475 Trabold Road, on Saturday, April 29, 2023, from 7:45 am to 12:00 pm.

Most HHW (paint, flammables and other chemicals from home-use) is safe when used and stored properly. When they become unwanted and are disposed of improperly, these household wastes can become environmental hazards.

To ensure safety and reduce waiting times, **appointments are required** at all HHW collections. **Appointments for this HHW collection will be accepted until April 28th.** Go on-line to <http://www.monroecounty.gov/ecopark/> to schedule your appointment. This Household Hazardous Waste collection is open to all Monroe County residents. Waste from businesses will not be accepted.

Up to 30 gallons of the following materials will be accepted per appointment at no charge:

- Oil-based & Latex Paint (for 1/3 gallon or less of **latex** paint: discard lid, add and mix kitty litter, let dry, place can in trash)
- Wood Stain & Preservatives
- Automotive Fluids (antifreeze; brake, power steering and transmission fluids)
- Pesticides & Fertilizers
- Flammable Products (gasoline, kerosene, thinners, strippers, solvents)
- Household Cleaners (liquid soaps & waxes, drain cleaners, etc.)
- Driveway Sealer
- Pool & Photo Chemicals
- Rechargeable (Ni-Cad) & Button Batteries
- Mercury (thermometers, thermostats)
- Syringes/Sharps (safely packaged)

Do Not Bring: used motor oil & vehicle batteries (contact service station or retailer); Pharmaceutical wastes, Propane tanks (permanent HHW facility/ecopark only), cans with **dried** paint (if it rattles when shaken – remove lid and place in trash); empty containers (trash or recycle); alkaline batteries (trash); glazing/spackle & joint compounds (trash).

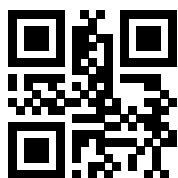

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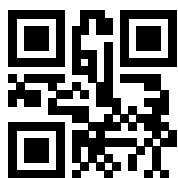

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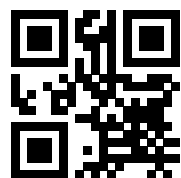
